

Class 1

Travelling the World.

Class 1 have quickly settled back into school. We have started a new topic called "Our World" in Geography which the children have enjoyed, particularly exploring atlases and globes. They are trying to learn the names of the 7 continents.

We are using the story "Owl Babies" for our new Literacy unit. This week we have been completing lots of reading tasks about the book to ensure we know the story really well. We continue to work on addition and subtraction in Maths. A very busy first week where the children have produced some fabulous work.

Class 2

Welcome Back!

We have had a great first week back after the half term! We have started our new English unit based on non-chronological reports, very different to the story writing we have done in the previous two units. The children have learnt what the features of a non-chronological report are and are becoming more familiar with these. In maths they are continuing to work hard on the addition and subtraction unit. All children are now using column addition and subtraction and their confidence in this is growing. In science we started our new topic of electricity we had a great discussion about appliances that use mains electricity, batteries or both. Finally, in history carrying on with Ancient Egyptians we have been mummifying an apple, checking them each day to see the change over time.
