#### **Headteacher's Welcome**



Dear Parent/Carer,

The end of Spring Term 1 is upon us. What a term it has been and certainly one that I wont forget. Like me, I am sure that you are all looking forward to the holiday and having some quality family time

etc. I have a few days at home and then a visit to London at the end of the week. Staying near to Wembley Stadium might me the closest that I get unless I get there to watch Southampton in the play offs maybe! Whatever you have planned, I hope it's a good one. Next term is much shorted due to Easter and then it will be summer (Always my favourite term).

Since I last wrote to you, a number of activities and changes have begun. The children have enjoyed a couple of lunchtime activities and this will continue next term. It was very apparent that the children were bored at lunch time which then results in 'rough play' etc. From next term, they will be kept busy and we will be trialling split KS2/KS1 lunches. This will allow more time for children to play and eat with their peers. The children will have to get used to no rushing their food and spending some quality social time together, something that we all fail on in this day and age.

After school clubs have been offered to the children for *FREE* next term. As you know, we have provided football and multi-skills. Around the school, I am still working on making Pytchley CofE an attractive place for visitors, staff and the children. Painting of corridors and walls has begun and will continue during half term. If anyone has anytime to volunteer and enjoys some DIY, please do give me a shout as more painting and clearing would certainly be appreciated. Thank you to the parents who helped me with some IKEA flat packed furniture this week. New library furniture has been ordered and at some point next term, the children and staff will be able to show a far greater love of reading. You will also notice that the spiritual garden is taking shape and it will continue to do so over the next days/weeks.

Attendance remains an area that I would like to improve and certainly need to approve at Pytchley CofE. During the last week of term you may receive information regarding your child's attendance. I will follow the trust's policy and my aim is to work with you to ensure that children are in school. The latest changes to safeguarding guidance now includes poor attendance as a form of *neglect* which gives even more reason to ensure children are in school learning. I am sure that you will appreciate any communications that are sent regarding attendance. My door is always open to discuss attendance with you. If you receive a letter requesting a meeting, please do respond so that we can meet in a caring environment.

Finally, you will also receive information with regards to behaviour at Pytchley CofE. Working together will be a key to ensuring that Pytchley CofE is known for its exemplary behaved and happy pupils. More information will follow.

#### **Neglect definitions**

As I mentioned in my 'Welcome' notes, attendance is now described as a possible form of neglect. More information from the Government is as follows:

The persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of the child's health or development.

Neglect may occur during pregnancy as a result of maternal substance abuse. Once a child is born, neglect may involve a parent or carer failing to:

- provide adequate food, clothing, and shelter (including exclusion from home or abandonment)
- protect a child from physical and emotional harm or danger
- ensure adequate supervision (including the use of inadequate caregivers)
- ensure access to appropriate medical care or treatment
- provide suitable education
- It may also include neglect of, or unresponsiveness to, a child's basic emotional needs

#### **FOPS**





The average daily time for all year groups is just 2mins (Y4 3 mins) This can improve and the impact will be massive on maths learning across the school.


We now have 24 members of the 144 club. Quickest time is Willow and Mrs E - 2mins 19 secs!


In your role as a governor, you will be supported in your duties by other experienced members of the AGC, the Headteacher, the PDET's Central Team and the Clerk to governors.
