Literacy

Key text: Who let the God's out! **Purpose for writing:** Myths and fables

Writing: Children will learn to write a myth and a fable linked to our key text (and informed by their knowledge gained in history this term). They will learn the features of myths and fables and learn how to use paragraphs to group information.
